Dear Mr. President:

Although I am mindful of the heavy burden on you due to the Gulf War, I am required to seek your help with a matter of grave concern to me and the organization which I represent.

The matter to which I refer is the appointment of Federal Judges throughout the country.

Our organization consists of over 3,000 experienced trial lawyers, one-half from the plaintiff's bar and one-half from the defense bar, whose stated purpose is the preservation and improvement of the civil jury trial system. We primarily dedicate our efforts to the Seventh Amendment of the Bill of Rights. A copy of the latest issue of our newsletter, the ABOTAGRAM, and copies of our Constitution, Bill of Rights and Amendments to the Constitution are enclosed for information about the organization.

It has recently come to my attention that there are numerous vacancies in the Federal Court system. It is my understanding that in many of these situations, qualified candidates have been recommended but not yet appointed. It is not our intention to become involved in the selection of individuals who are appointed to the Federal Bench. We do, however, urge those appointments be made as expeditiously as possible, full well understanding that a certain amount of time is necessary to screen applicants in order to obtain the best possible person for the position. With the number of vacancies that now exist, the case load upon those who are already in the Federal District Court system is extremely burdensome and in some cases totally unmanageable.

Recently I was advised that all civil jury trials in the Northern District of Florida have been suspended, as the case load of those judges now sitting is so great they only have time to keep up with the criminal cases which must be expedited. 

As you know, the Civil Justice Reform Act of 1990 cails on each district to establish an Advisory Group to study its civil docket and develop a plan for reducing costs and delay. We are writing to recommend, for your consideration, outstanding lawyers in your area for membership in the district's Advisory Group because of their expertise in litigation management and alternative dispute resolution (ADR), two key areas of inquiry under the Act. The attorneys noted are members of the Center for Public Resources Legal Program, a nonprofit nationwide organization of leading corporate counsel, defense and plaintiffs' firms. legal academics and federal judges established in 1979 to reduce the costs and delays of major civil litigation. Material describing CPR in more detail is enclosed.

The CPR Judicial Project has been instrumental in developing judicial ADR use in the federal courts and increasing judicial and bar awareness of ADR. CPR's ADR and the Courts: A Handbook for Judges and Lawyers (Butterworth Legal Publishers, 1987) and its supplement, the CPR Practice Guide on ADR in Federal and State Courts (1990) are standard references in this area which should be especially useful to the Advisory Group. Similarly, CPR's model ADR procedures, case histories and forms are valuable tools for judges who are interested in the use of ADR techniques such as mediation, minitrial, summary jury trial, discovery management and multiparty cooperation, among others. Over the coming months, we shall provide additional information to you to assist in this effort, and shall provide CPR members serving on Advisory Groups with publications and research assistance.

Although opinions vary about the Civil Justice Reform Act, the Advisory Group process offers a valuable opportunity for the bench and bar to examine the role of judicial ADR in reducing the costs and delays of litigation. The participation of one or more of the noted lawyers skilled in the requisite areas of ADR and litigation management, and otherwise possessing outstanding professional qualifications, should contribute significantly to the development of a successful delay and cost reduction plan for the district.
