Judge Kendall was appointed to the United States District Court for the Northern District of Illinois in January 2006. She has sat by designation with the Seventh, Ninth, and Federal Circuit Courts of Appeals. She teaches law at the University of Chicago, Northwestern University, and the Loyola University School of Law and trains judges domestically and internationally on a variety of topics. She served for six years as a member of the Judicial Conference Committee on Codes of Conduct. Prior to her appointment, she served as Deputy Chief in the Criminal Division of the United States Attorney's Office in Chicago where she worked for over ten years. Judge Kendall's areas of expertise include human trafficking, public corruption, and judicial ethics.

Judge Kendall received her Bachelor of Arts and Master of Arts degrees from Northwestern University and her J.D. from Loyola University School of Law.
