1 **SEC. 602. FULL-TIME STATUS OF COURT REPORTERS.**

2 Section 753(e) of title 28, United States Code, is
3 amended by inserting after the first sentence the follow-
4 ing: "For the purposes of subchapter III of chapter 83
5 of title 5 and chapter 84 of such title, a reporter shall
6 be considered a full-time employee during any pay period
7 for which a reporter receives a salary at the annual salary
8 rate fixed for a full-time reporter pursuant to the preced-
9 ing sentence."

10 **SEC. 603. FEDERAL JUDICIAL CENTER.**

11 (a) **FUNCTIONS.**—Subsection 620(b) of title 28,
12 United States Code, is amended—

13 (1) in paragraph (4) by striking "and" at the
14 end thereof;

15 (2) in paragraph (5) by striking the period and
16 inserting "; and"; and

17 (3) by adding at the end thereof the following
18 new paragraph:

19 "(6) insofar as may be consistent with the per-
20 formance of the other functions set forth in this sec-
21 tion, to cooperate with and assist agencies of the
22 Federal Government and other appropriate organiza-
23 tions in providing information and advice to further
24 improvement in the administration of justice in the
25 courts of foreign countries and to acquire informa-
26 tion about judicial administration in foreign coun-
