





ADVISORY COMMITTEES



- o Appellate, District, Bankruptcy, Magistrate
- o Members serve for 3-year terms (normally renewable once)
- Provide advice and guidance
- Assist with identifying needs/competencies, consult on curriculum, may serve as faculty
- o Meetings
